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# Baseline Formula

The OEC used data in ECE Reporter to calculate Baseline  
Funding amounts using this 5 Step Process

## Step 1: Add up the funds your program received for the last 2 fiscal years

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This is the amount your program received (what we paid you) for used spaces through Child Day Care Contracts and School Readiness grants. Check your monthly reports that were submitted in ECE Reporter to find the number.

Then combine the funds for the last two fiscal years. Remember that fiscal years are different than calendar years.

- Fiscal Year (FY) 2023: July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023
- Fiscal Year (FY) 2024: July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024

That amount is your **total funds earned**.

EXAMPLE:

\$45,000 [total funds earned FY 2023] + \$47,000 [total funds earned FY 2024] = \$92,000 [total funds earned]



## Step 2: Add the funds your program was eligible to receive for the last 3 fiscal years

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Now, add up the amount that you were **allocated** (what you were eligible to receive based on the full number of spaces). You can check your contract or grant award to find the number. It might be higher than the amount you actually earned.

Do this for the last 2 years.

- Fiscal Year (FY) 2023: July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023
- Fiscal Year (FY) 2024: July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024

That is your **total funds allocated**.

EXAMPLE:

$\$50,000$  [total funds allocated FY 2023] +  $\$50,000$  [total funds allocated FY 2024] =  $\$100,000$  [total funds allocated]



## Step 3: Divide the total funds earned by the total funds allocated

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This will give you a percentage that is your **average utilization**.

EXAMPLE:

$\$92,000$  [total funds earned] /  $\$100,000$  [total funds allocated] = 0.92 (92% average utilization)



## Step 4: Add a 4% bonus to your average utilization (up to 100%)

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This will give you your **final percentage**. The final percentage cannot exceed 100%. The 4% bonus ensures programs are eligible for the same amount or more funding than they have been receiving the past 2 years.

EXAMPLE:

$$92\% \text{ [average utilization]} + 4\% \text{ [bonus]} = 96\% \text{ [final percentage]}$$



## Step 5: Get the funds your program is eligible to receive for fiscal year 2025

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You can find this number in your contract or grant award.

- Fiscal Year 2025: July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025



## **Step 6: Multiply your fiscal year 2025 contract number by your final percentage**

This is your final estimate baseline funding amount.

EXAMPLE:

$$\$100,000 \text{ [total funds allocated FY 2025]} \times 0.96 \text{ (96\%)} \text{ [final percentage]} = \$96,000$$

# Spaces and Funding, cont.

\* OEC Licensing allows a child to be enrolled in a preschool space at 2.8 years as a three-year old providing each of the following requirements are met:

- The child care center or group child care home is licensed by OEC
- The program holds a preschool endorsement on their DCCC or DCGH license;
- The program obtains authorization from the child's parent or guardian to enroll the child in preschool;
- The program director provides authorization for the enrollment of the child in preschool;
- Written authorizations are maintained on file.

\*\*Programs can choose between 10 or 12 months of care for only the space types indicated.

# Head Start

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## Early Start Connecticut Request for Application

### Head Start

Applicants for Early Start CT (State Head Start) must be a federal Head Start/Early Head Start grant recipient and/or delegate agency who currently receives the State Head Start Supplement grant. Head Start/Early Head Start Partners may not apply for Early Start CT (State Head Start)

- Pursuant to [legislation](#), State Head Start funding is to be allocated in the following way:

75% of total funding is to:

- Create new extended day, year-round spaces for HS/EHS classrooms
- Create new full day, year-round spaces for HS/EHS classrooms
- Expand existing federal HS/EHS spaces to extended day, year-round classrooms
- Expand existing federal HS/EHS spaces to full day, year-round classrooms

- 25% of total funding is to be for the purpose of enhancing program quality.

- **100% of funding amount is 27319.39**

- **75% of funding amount is 20489.54**

- **25% of funding amount is 6829.85**
