

Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program

The Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program provides voluntary, evidence-based home visiting programs for pregnant people and families with children through kindergarten entry living in communities at risk for poor maternal and child health outcomes. The MIECHV Program builds upon decades of scientific research. It shows that home visits by a nurse, social worker, early childhood educator, or other trained professional during pregnancy and in the first years of a child's life improves the lives of children and families.

States and territories receive funding through the MIECHV Program. They have the flexibility to tailor their programs to serve the specific needs of their communities. By law, grantees must demonstrate improvement for eligible families participating in the program in at least four of the six benchmark areas: improved maternal and newborn health; prevention of child injuries, child abuse, neglect, or maltreatment, and reduction of emergency department visits; improvement in school readiness and achievement; reduction in crime or domestic violence; improvements in family economic self-sufficiency; and improvements in the coordination and referrals for other community resources and supports.

In October 2016, HRSA revised the performance reporting requirements for MIECHV Program state and territory awardees after a year-long process that included input from state awardees, federal partners, home visiting model developers, and other stakeholders. The update aimed to ensure accountability in demonstrating outcomes. In October 2021, HRSA revised the existing performance measurement system, which the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) approved in July 2021. Awardees began implementing the revised measures in October 2021. These updates include a specification revision for Measures 16, updates to missing data guidance for Measures 17-19, and the inclusion of two optional reporting measures to collect information on substance use screening and referrals (Optional Measures 1 and 2).

The measures are categorized into two types: performance indicators and systems outcomes. Performance indicators are relatively proximal to the home visiting intervention or shown to be sensitive to home visiting alone. Systems outcome measures are more distal to the home visiting intervention and/or are less sensitive to change due to home visiting alone due to many factors, including confounding influences or differences in available system infrastructure at the state- or community-level.
